What makes the International Baccalaureate® unique?

The International Baccalaureate® (IB) offers a continuum of high quality education that encourages international-mindedness and a positive attitude to learning. The programs are accessible to students in 141 countries through close cooperation with the worldwide community of IB World Schools.

The three programs for students aged 3 to 19 help develop the intellectual, personal, emotional and social skills to live, learn and work in a rapidly globalizing world.

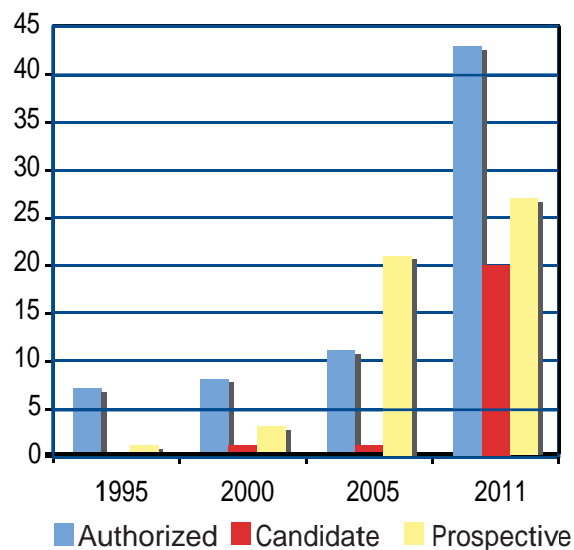
Each program includes a curriculum and pedagogy, student assessment appropriate to the age range, professional development for teachers and a process of school authorization and evaluation. The programs are available through 3,294 IB World Schools across the globe.

The Primary Years Program for students aged 3 to 12 focuses on the development of the whole child in the classroom and in the world outside. The teachers develop a program of inquiry and in depth investigations into important ideas, which require a high level of involvement on the part of the students. These inquiries are substantial, in-depth and often last for several weeks.

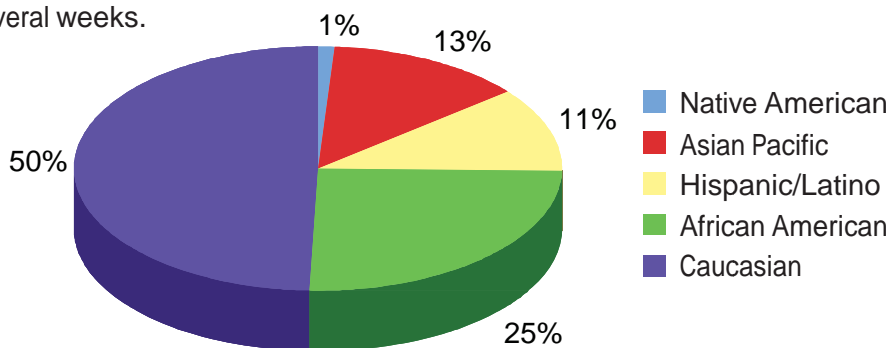
The Middle Years Program for students aged 11 to 16 provides a framework of academic challenge and life skills, achieved through embracing and transcending traditional school subjects.

The Diploma Program for students aged 16 to 19 is a demanding two-year curriculum leading to final examinations and a qualification that is welcomed by leading universities around the world which may be accepted for college credit.
